Singing at the Superbowl--specifically entering MetLife stadium and looking up at the HUGE crowd of people.

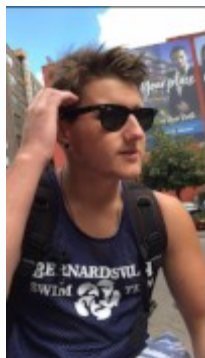
The performance right before going to ACDA--singing Psalm 23 that night was ethereal. Canada 2016--Fundy Sound was SO much fun...and my first time out of the US.

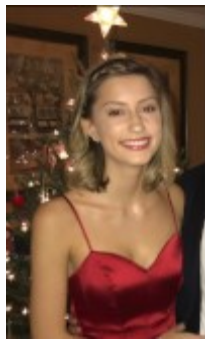
posters of kids who had beat cancer. It warmed my heart that we could be a part of such an incredible event.
